We expect you to have a research profile with a focus on German history and another one on European, non-European or global history of the Middle Ages. You can demonstrate your expertise by internationally visible publications and an active scholarly network. In addition, you have a lively interest in current theories and debates concerning historical science, cultural studies, and/or the social sciences as well as an open-mindedness towards the Digital Humanities. A proven record of third-party funding is a prerequisite.
